The relative strengths and weaknesses of CHASE GENERAL CORP are analyzed with respect to the market average, including all of its competitors. We analyzed all variables having an effect on the Economic Capital Ratio.

The greatest strength of CHASE GENERAL CORP compared to the market average is the variable Other Revenues, increasing the Economic Capital Ratio by 232% points. The greatest weakness of CHASE GENERAL CORP is the variable Expenses, reducing the Economic Capital Ratio by 115% points.

The company's Economic Capital Ratio, given in the ranking table, is 204%, being 182% points above the market average of 22%.
