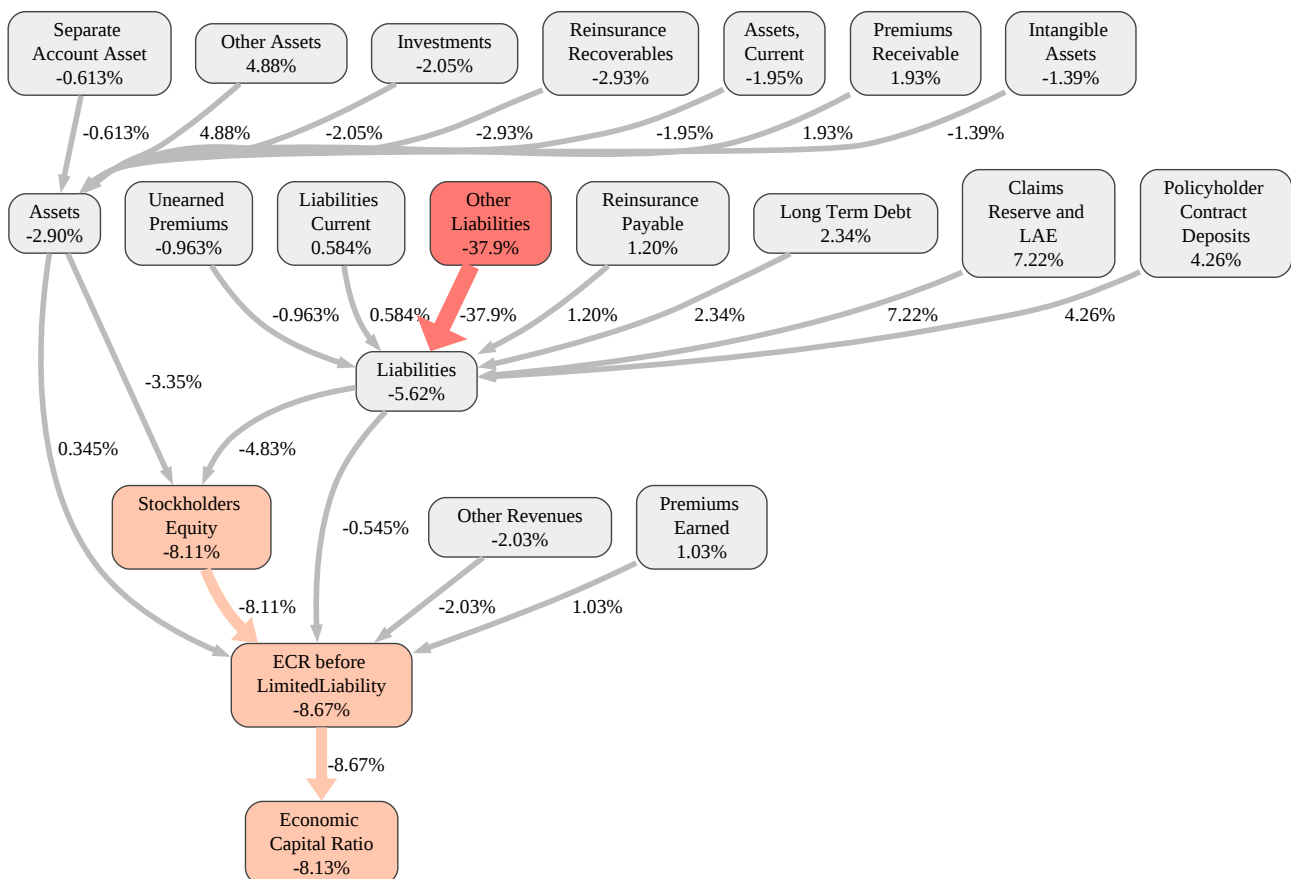




The relative strengths and weaknesses of OLD Republic International CORP are analyzed with respect to the market average, including all of its competitors. We analyzed all variables having an effect on the Economic Capital Ratio.

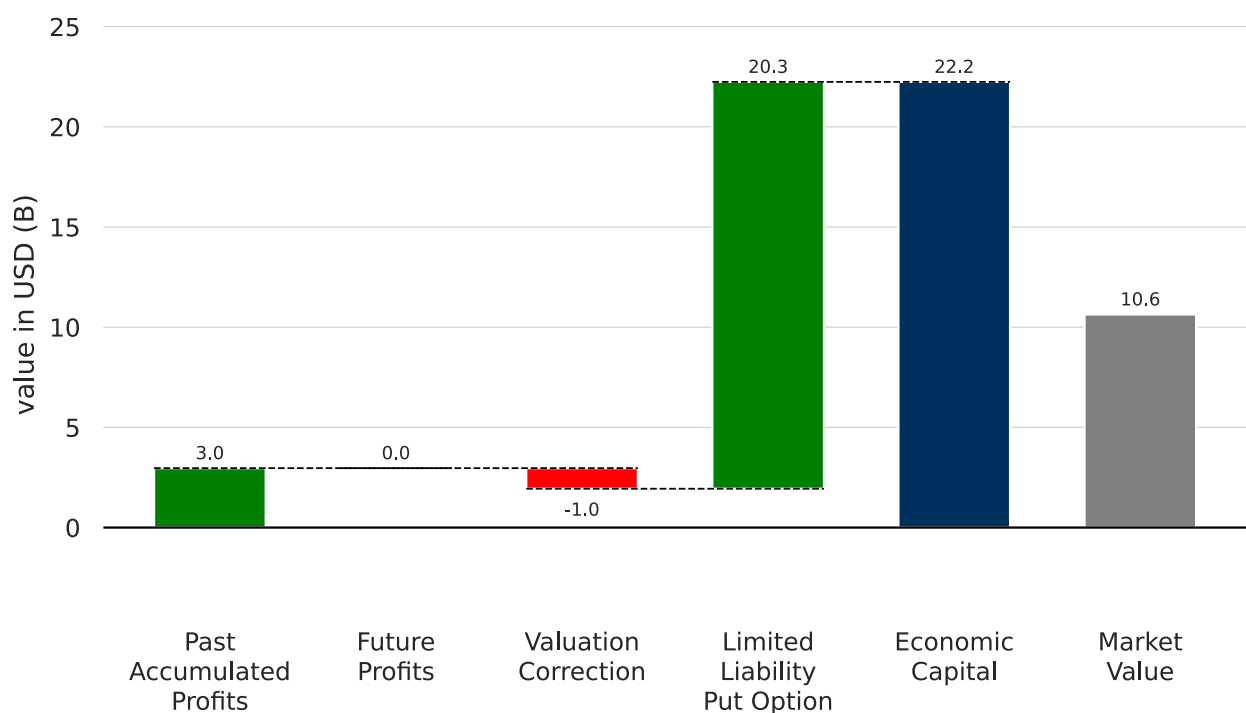
The greatest strength of OLD Republic International CORP compared to the market average is the variable Claims Reserve and LAE, increasing the Economic Capital Ratio by 7.2% points. The greatest weakness of OLD Republic International CORP is the variable Other Liabilities, reducing the Economic Capital Ratio by 38% points.

The company's Economic Capital Ratio, given in the ranking table, is 83%, being 8.1% points below the market average of 91%.

Company Valuation: OLD Republic International CORP



The RealRate Economic Capital of a company is its Past Accumulated Profits plus its Future Profits plus its Valuation Correction plus its Limited Liability Put Option. Past Accumulated Profits and Future Profits can be negative. The Limited Liability Put Option accounts for the limited liability of the shareholders, so the Economic Capital never falls below zero. Where the company is listed, its market value is shown next to it.
